Program name:	Tufts in Talloires MacJannet Scholars
Continuing Program:	This is a continuing program for the Foundation
Program description:	The MacJannet Scholarships are financial awards for those Tufts University students who apply for financial aid to attend the Tufts in Talloires program. Scholarships are awarded based on a number of factors including, academic merit, financial need and civic minded-ness. The scholarship essay and an interview are also factors that are taken into consideration.
Program objectives:	The objective of the MacJannet Scholarships is to provide financial aid to Tufts students who might otherwise not be able to attend the Tufts in Talloires program. Tufts University strongly promotes study abroad experiences and Tufts in Talloires provides this opportunity for many students who, for any number of reasons, are not able to spend a semester or a year abroad. By providing an opportunity for financial aid, we are able to include students who would normally not be able to attend this (or possibly any other) study abroad program.
Who benefits:	The beneficiaries are those Tufts students who register for the Tufts in Talloires program and who apply for MacJannet scholarships.
How do they benefit:	The beneficiaries of MacJannet Scholarships benefit by being able to attend the Tufts in Talloires Program.
Expand Mac community?	MacJannet Scholars as well as all Tufts in Talloires students become part of a network of Tufts in Talloires alumni - all of whom receive annual mailings from the Tufts University European Center. Very often these informational mailings include updates on the activities of the MacJannet Foundation. MacJannet Scholars are also asked to give 5-6 hours of work time to the European Center in exchange for their scholarship awards so they spend a little more time than other students integrated in the workings of the Tufts European Center and Tufts in Talloires program. This generally fosters a closer relationship with the Priory, with the European Center and with Talloires. Finally, in their MacJannet Scholarship interviews, students are told about the MacJannet Legacy and asked how they will perpetuate MacJannet values and the themes such as "Educating the Whole Person" and "Global Citizenship" once they have left Talloires. This helps reinforce the presence of these themes in the Tufts in Talloires program.

Be inspired by the Prieure:	Because the MacJannet Scholars take their Tufts in Talloires classes at le Prieuré, they have a daily access to and interaction with our beautiful and inspirational building. Because some of the tasks that MacJannet Scholars perform in exchange for their scholarship involve taking care of the building, many of the MacJannet scholars develop a special relationship with the Prieuré! The Tufts in Talloires program can only take place at le Prieuré.
Leverage inspirational attributes?	Full Glass
Educational Themes?	The MacJannet Scholars and the Tufts in Talloires program exemplify perfectly the MacJannet educational themes and values. Students come to Tufts in Talloires to supplement and enhance their education as well as their cultural awareness and understanding. One of the criteria for the Tufts in Talloires courses is that they are linked to the region. By tying academics to the area, we foster international understanding. Classes must also include an experiential component. This reinforces the education of the whole person. Students are in home stay situations which certainly promotes France American relations. Tufts in Talloires extra curricular activities include regular guided hikes into the mountains to teach students about the flora and fauna of the Alpine region. A Talloires Kids! Day is also organized which integrates MacScholars and other Tufts in Talloires students with the Talloires community. All of these activities are true reflections of MacJannet educational themes and values.

Other comments:	Last year (program year 2004), Tufts University through the office of the Provost, picked up the cost of the annual MacJannet Dinner/Reception which was formerly organized and paid for by the MacJannet Foundation. I think it would be appropriate for this cost (approx\$10,000) to be rededicated to the MacJannet

Scholarship program. We are also seeing a huge surge in the popularity of the Tufts in Talloires program, and consequently also in the need for scholarship awards to help students cover the costs of this program. Because it is a summer program, students cannot apply regular financial aid to cover the cost of the program. We are invested in doing as much as possible to help as many students as possible have this experience and ask for additional help from the MacJannet Foundation to do so.

Program description:	The Foundation collaborates with the Amis du Prieure in sponsoring a symposium on an important MacJannet values topic, such as French-American relations. The symposium features a key-note speaker of international acclaim. The event takes place during the regular Amis du Prieure evening at the Prieure- just before or after the Foundation annual meeting.
Program objectives:	Perpetuate the MacJannet spirit of the Prieure by reviving the tradition of the Entretiens that were hosted by the MacJannets. This is the Foundation's signature event- leveraged through the organizational resources and capabilities of the Amis du Prieure.
Who benefits:	The Tufts European Center, the MacJannet Foundation, and the MacJannet community and the regional community. All seekers of truth. All constituents of the MacJannet Community participate
How do they benefit:	They experience a unique MacJannet exchange of ideas on a great topic and are inspired to unleash their creativity and to promote international understanding.
Expand Mac community?	This event is designed to welcome and introduce new members to the community at the same time to provide an actual experience of the MacJannet intellectual and cultural esprit.

Be inspired by the Prieure:	The event is designed to use the Prieure, its setting and its facilities to maximum effect, just as the Entretiens did so when the MacJannets ran these events themselves.

Educational Themes?	It will challenge people to achieve their potential; and live their gifts while fostering international understanding and world peace. It promotes French - American relations through the experiential dimension of collaboration and participation.

In future years as the Entretiens grows in significance, the MacJannet Foundation will be identified with this event as its signature event that permits all constituents to participate and provides the opportunity to have a first hand MacJannet Experience.

Continuing Program:	This is a continuing program for the Foundation
Program description:	Two students from Fletcher and two students from HEI exchange yearly in a program that was begun by Donald and Charlotte MacJannet in 1967
Program objectives:	Furthering the education of the students who participate, and encouraging their involvement with international relations, European-American relations and the MacJannet "family" in their professional and personal futures
Who benefits:	The students, their hosting institutions, the MacJannet communities in Boston and Geneva (and others they might meet through their travels)
How do they benefit:	Carefully chosen graduate students have the opportunity to complete degree requirements of the hosting institution within a very intense year to year and a half program. The students have chosen to apply because of the particular academic and co-curricular offerings of the host institution. They also benefit from career advice and access in the other country in a way they would be unable to do otherwise. They also are exposed to the very special MacJannet story, and often mention how compelling it is in their lives.
Expand Mac community?	The students represent and embody the ideals of the community, throughout their lives - there all well over 100 who have now participated, for nearly 40 years. Adding new individuals to overseer and trustee status in the foundation is already well underway from this program. And, yes, they can be and have been new donors. There needs to be more thought about connecting this program naturally to the Prieure locally (if by local we also include Geneva). Perhaps consideration can be given to granting program exchange participants free or reduced participation in the annual Fletcher program at the Prieure to entice them into Prieure knowledge and usage.

Be inspired by the Prieure:	This is not its main focus, and making it so would be difficult. However, we can cross-reference opportunities as they arise. A number of MacJannet exchange scholars have worked at the Prieure, and at least one (this author) was director there.

Educational Themes?	It fills all these criteria, in varying degrees, depending on the individual participant.

Names of stake holders:	The Fletcher School, Tufts University The Graduate Institute of International Studies, University of Geneva MacJannet Foundation members in Boston and Geneva
Qualifications of organizers:	Fletcher participants have completed one year of master's degree work, need at least basic French Geneva participants are recent recipients of the License, and have good English. Each academic institution represents the best of its kind in their respective countries.
Role of stake holders:	Fletcher and HEI select and orient the students. Each student has an academic adviser and benefits from full enrollment and entitlements of each institution. Geneva and Boston foundation/community members are informal host families and provide information, as requested, to the institutions.
How measured?	Each student provides a bio sketch and other information for the newsletter. Follow up surveys have not been conducted and are an excellent idea - for which some additional funding might be requested for the 40th anniversary year - it would be good to have this incredible success story documented.

Program description:	CPMA is a music school in Annecy, founded in 1985 with the help of Charlotte MacJannet. This school, with currently over 1000 students, was formed by MacJannet values and perpetuates them.
Program objectives:	To welcome all students into the realm of music so that each person is served by performing on an instrument without regard to age, ability or taste.
Who benefits:	The students, ages from 3 to 90
How do they benefit:	The students benefit directly in the class situation. However, when the students perform -- either individually, in chamber ensembles or in orchestra -- Annecy and its community benefit. As in the days of the MacJannets, the CPMA is also performing again at the Prieure.
Expand Mac community?	The MacJannet values are integral to the CPMA philosophy. Charlotte MacJannet felt that music is the international language and that it is equally a language for self-communication. Through the classes and the concerts the MacJannet values are perpetuated.

Dear John,

I am leaving for a few days and did not find neither the technical way to access to documents nor the time to write calmly about the program.. And I will not be able to do so before the March1 deadline.

So I am writing to you about 2 programs.

One is OK, because we know the Amis du prieuré very well. I am asking for an increase of the money we give them to send people the other way of the Atlantic. This year's gift was 500\$ and was fine, especially because we only asked for this at the last minute. I really appreciate it was given to them.

I wish an increase for next year to 1000\$. As you know, they not only send one scholar to Tuft as usual, but they have also launched a big program with LM. BAUDRY on June 13 in order to go deeper into the question of Franco-American relations, and they have to pay the lecturer for this, even if he is asking only a short part of the normal cost. I find it courageous, and a sign they want to change dimension of their group. I wish our grant can be risen to 1000\$

The second program, in which I have unfortunately not had time to go further, but do so in second half of March, is to associate in one way -weekend in Talloires, or other contribution, such as meeting in Paris or Talloires between the members of the 2 organisations- let say creating of contact with the Franco-American Fulbright Commission in order to increase the impact of our actions by exchanging and doing common actions.

At this stage I am not able to tell more, but I would like that the Foundation when she meets can hear about a more precise program and vote on a sum which we would use for this action. The amount I am asking for is 1000\$, too.

I will get in touch with you the week of March 7th - when I am in Talloires where I hope you can visit me! and we will together complete the documents if I have a printer working there.

I am sorry to be late. At least you know what I have in mind, and we will discuss it soon in order to send the papers in the regular form. Please be my advocate near George and Bob.
